By providing this notice, Passco does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of Maine law, the applicability of the Maine data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

Since the April 2026 notice, Passco undertook significant work to locate addresses for additional impacted individuals so that notice could be provided. This work was completed on May 19, 2026. On June 11, 2026, Passco provided written notice of this incident to an additional ten (10) Maine residents. The information subject to unauthorized access for individuals notified on June 11, 2026, varies by individual but includes name, Social Security number, driver's license or state identification number, and financial account information. Eleven (11) total Maine residents have been notified of this event. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as *Exhibit B*.

Upon discovering the event, Passco moved quickly to investigate and respond to the incident, assess the security of Passco systems, and identify potentially affected individuals. Passco is also working to implement additional safeguards and training to its employees. Passco is providing access to credit monitoring services for twelve (12) months, through Experian, to individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident, at no cost to these individuals.

Additionally, Passco is providing impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud. Passco is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one’s credit file, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies, information on how to obtain a free credit report, a reminder to remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing account statements and monitoring free credit reports, and encouragement to contact the Federal Trade Commission, their state Attorney General, and law enforcement to report attempted or actual identity theft and fraud. As a result of the investigation, Passco determined that limited information was taken from its environment during the period of unauthorized access on August 7, 2025. Passco then engaged a third party to conduct a comprehensive and time-consuming review of the information at risk in order to identify the type of information contained therein, and to whom the information relates. On December 16, 2025, Passco received the results of this review and identified that information pertaining to certain individuals was involved. Since then, Passco has been performing additional work to review and verify the affected information as well as locate address information in order to provide direct notice to affected individuals.

The information that could have been subject to unauthorized access for the Maine resident includes name and Social Security number.

Notice to Maine Resident

On April 17, 2026, Passco began providing written notice of this incident to one (1) Maine resident. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as *Exhibit A*.

Other Steps Taken and To Be Taken

Upon discovering the event, Passco moved quickly to investigate and respond to the incident, assess the security of Passco systems, and identify potentially affected individuals. Passco is also working to implement additional safeguards and training to its employees. Passco is providing access to credit monitoring services for twelve (12) months, through Experian, to individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident, at no cost to these individuals.

Additionally, Passco is providing impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud.
